PREFACE

Ten years ago, following a third visit to Bermuda in 1985, an article of this series, THE TUZO FAMILY (SPEC-Jan.8,1985), recalled the links to Bermuda of the well-known Tuzo family of Gaspé. The names of Joseph Stowe Tuzo and his wife, Mary Eve, recall, in fact, the Bermudian families of Stowe and Eve in addition to that of Tuzo. Publication of THE TUZO FAMILY resulted in interesting exchanges of information with several Tuzo descendants including the eminent Canadian scientist, Dr. John Tuzo Wilson.

A fourth visit to Bermuda in March/April, 1995 permitted further search of the fascinating records of the Bermuda Historical Society on Queen Street, Hamilton. The following notes on the Tuzo, Stowe and Eve families serve to supplement the TUZO FAMILY article of a decade ago.

- 1837, Sept. 19: Sarah Esther Tuzo, eldest daughter of Capt. James Tuzo, married Alphonso J. Hurst in Pembroke on Sept. 16, by Rev. J.F. Lightbourn.
- 1839, Aug. 6: Alice Tuzo, aged 85, widow of Thomas Tuzo, died in Pembroke on July 31.

- 1842, Sept. 13: John Tuzo, in his 23rd year, 3rd son of Thomas S. Tuzo, died in Pembroke on Sept.9.
- 1843, June 6: Joseph S. Tuzo, aged 51, a native of Bermuda, died on April 9 at Percé, Canada East, leaving a widow and 6 children. He had lived in Canada for 22 years.
- 1843, Dec. 19: Eliza Stowe Tuzo, 2nd daughter of Thomas S. Tuzo, married Henry G. Cox at Pembroke Church on Dec.12.
- 1845, Sept. 9: Edith Stowe Tuzo, elder daughter of Thomas S. Tuzo, married Henry Mills Stowe at Pembroke Church on Sept. 4.
- 1848, March 28: Henrietta Stowe Tuzo, 3rd daughter of Thomas S. Tuzo, M.C.P., married Samuel S.I. Frith on March 23 at St. Andrew's Church.
- 1849, Nov. 27: Capt. Henry H. Tuzo, aged 59, died at his Quebec residence on Oct. 22, leaving a wife and 2 children.
- 1852, April 6: Capt. Thomas Tuzo, of the brig Hummingbird, married Rebecca Dill, youngest daughter of the late Daniel Dill, on Feb. 21, by Rev. Mr. Ritchie.

- 1852, Sept. 7: Miss Alice Stowe Tuzo, only daughter of the late Joseph S. Tuzo, married Samuel P. Watson on Aug.18 at St. John's Church, Percé, District of Gaspé, Canada East.
- 1853, Jan. 4: Mrs. Mary Tuzo, aged 59, widow of Joseph S. Tuzo, died at Percé, Canada East, on Dec. 3, 1852, leaving 4 sons and a daughter.
- 1853, June 21: Rosa Tuzo, aged 8 months, daughter of Thomas E. Tuzo, died in Southampton on June 7.
- 1853, July 19: Capt. Luke Stowe Tuzo married Alicia Deane, eldest daughter of the late William Deane, in Paget on July 14, by Rev. F.J.R. Lightbourn.
- 1854, April 25: Thomas R. Tuzo, in his 33rd year, only son of James Tuzo of Bermuda, died in Antigua on March 20. He had been for many years a partner in the late firm of Messrs. Hurst, Turner, & Co.
- 1855, Sept. 4: James Tuzo, aged 74, died in Hamilton on Sept.2, leaving 2 daughters, brothers and sisters. He had been in mercantile business for 40 years.
- 1855, Oct. 2: Julia Stowe Tuzo, 2nd daughter of Thomas S. Tuzo, married Rev. James Wesley Horne on Sept. 26 at Wesley Church, Hamilton.
- 1856, March 18: Sarah Tuzo, alias Statia Jones, aged 98, died on March 11 in Smith's Parish.
- 1856, April 22: Thomas E. Tuzo, birth of a daughter on March 8 at Percé, Canada East.
- 1859, May 17: Capt. Francis E. Tuzo married Sarah George, daughter of the late Capt. Richard W. George, in Pembroke on May 12, by Rev. J.F. Lightbourn.
- 1862, Feb. 25: Capt. Benjamin Tuzo, aged about 65, died on Feb. 9 at Port Royal, S.C., on board S.S. Oriental, of which his only son is commander. He left a wife and 2 children. Burial in Harlem, New York, on Feb. 15.
- 1864, Feb. 23: Richard Tuzo, aged 99, died in Pembroke on Feb.5, leaving a widow.
- 1864, May 17: Capt. Joseph S. Tuzo, in his 48th year, died en route from Benin, Africa, to Liverpool, England, leaving a widow, 2 children, parents, a brother, and sisters. He was the eldest son of Thomas S. Tuzo of Bermuda.
- 1864, May 17: Francis E. Tuzo, birth of a son in Brooklyn, N.Y., on April 23.
- 1866, Jan. 16: Mary Tuzo, aged about 50, daughter of the late James Tuzo, died in Hamilton on Jan. 12.
- 1867, Aug. 27: Alicia Tuzo, wife of Capt. Luke S. Tuzo, and eldest daughter of the late William Deane, barrister-at-law, died at her Paget residence on Aug. 22.

- 1890, Sept. 2: Louisa Jauncey Tuzo, in her 94th year, widow of Benjamin Tuzo, died on Aug. 20 at her residence, Applethorpe, Fanwood, New Jersey.
- 1891, May 12: Joseph Richard Tuzo of Hamilton married Miss Helena Anna Armstrong on April 28 at the bride's residence in Somerset, by Rev. J. Bellord, Roman Catholic Chaplain to the Forces.

- 1892, April 12: Helen Anna Tuzo, in her 28th year, wife of J.R. Tuzo, died at Brunswick Cottage, Hamilton, on April 5.
- 1895, Aug. 13: Mrs. Sarah Jane Tuzo, in her 78th year, died on Aug. 5 at Stanley Cottage, Paget.
- 1897, Feb. 23: Capt. Luke Stowe Tuzo, aged 79, died on Feb. 13 at the Mental Hospital, Devonshire.
- 1901, March 12: Edith Stowe, aged 79, widow of H.M. Stowe, and daughter of the late Thomas S. and Esther Tuzo, died in Brooklyn on March 6 at the home of her sister, Mrs. J.W. Horne.
- 1903, Oct. 6: Sarah Tuzo, aged 67, widow of Capt. Francis E. Tuzo, died in Pembroke on Oct. 5. Funeral at St. John's Church.
- 1903, Nov. 7: Thomas Stowe Tuzo of Hamilton married Laura Josephine Peniston, youngest daughter of W.O.S. Peniston of Harrington House, Bailey's Bay, at Holy Trinity Church, Bailey's Bay, on Nov. 5. Description of wedding.
- 1907, Oct. 8: Joseph R. Tuzo married Annie E. Onion, daughter of the late William Onion, Engineer, R.N., both of Bermuda, on Oct. 3 at Ozone Park, New York

- 1796, Aug. 27: Mrs. Stowe, wife of Capt. Richard Stowe, died at Spanish Point. No date given.
- 1810, Sept. 29: W.R. Stowe, of Spanish Point, married Miss Love Godfrey, also of Spanish Point, on Sept. 20.
- 1812, Dec. 26: Mrs. Susanna Stowe died on Dec. 21, at Hamilton.
- 1813, Oct. 16: Solomon J. Stowe died at Hamilton on Oct. 7.
- 1814, Oct. 29: Joseph Stowe died in Hamilton on Oct. 21.
- 1815, Jan. 7: Miss Susanna G. Stowe, daughter of Capt. Thomas Stowe, married William B. Perot at Hamilton, on Dec. 22, 1814, by Rev. Mr. Ewing.
- 1815, Feb. 11: Joseph Stowe, in his 74th year, died on Feb. 7 at his residence, Point Shares, Spanish Point. He had suffered many and great infirmities, and had been blind for 4 years.
- 1815, Feb. 11: Mrs. Betsey Stowe, wife of Joseph Stowe, above, died on Jan. 6, aged 67; she had been blind for 17 years.
- 1816, Jan. 20: Mrs. Love Stowe, aged 29, wife of W.R. Stowe, died at Point Shares on Jan. 13.
- 1817, Sept. 27: Capt. Nathaniel Stowe, aged 67, died at Hamilton on Sept. 10.
- 1819, Sept. 18: Miss Elizabeth Holliday Stowe married John Eve on Sept. 16, by Rev. R. Hoare.
- 1820, June 3: Mrs. Sophia Stowe, aged 43, widow of Solomon J. Stowe, died on June 2, at her residence at the Lane, near Hamilton.
- 1820, June 24: Mrs. Dill, wife of Worshipful David Dill, and daughter of John Stowe, merchant, of Hamilton, died on June 18 in Devonshire.
- 1823, Jan. 18: Mrs. Susanna Stowe, aged 87, widow of Joseph Stowe, senior, of Point Shares, died on Jan. 12, at the residence of George Harvey in Devonshire.
- 1823, May 24: Sophia Stowe, eldest daughter of the late Solomon J. Stowe, married John Cox, both of Hamilton, in Pembroke Church on May 20, by Rev. Mr. Coster.
- 1826, March 4: John Stowe died at Crow Lane on Feb. 27, at an advanced age.
- 1826, March 18: John Stowe, aged 83, died on Feb. 27 at his Paget residence, a leading partner of one of the oldest mercantile establishments in the Colony. Of a once-  
numerous family, there is left only one son and one daughter, and several grandchildren.
- 1826, June 17: Capt. Thomas Stowe married Miss K.J. Wainwright in Hamilton on June 10.
- 1826, July 22: Mrs. Elizabeth Stowe, widow of Joseph Stowe, died at her Paget residence on July 19.
- 1828, Feb. 26: Catherine Stowe, youngest daughter of the late Thomas Stowe, married Francis Augustus Eve, M.D., on Feb. 23, by Rev. J.F. Lightbourn.
- 1829, May 26: Mrs. K. Jane Stowe, in her 23rd year, a native of Bermuda, died at Trinidad on April 28.
- 1832, March 20: Mrs. Julia Stowe, in her 67th year, died at Hamilton on March 13.
- 1832, Aug. 7: Joseph Morris Stowe, aged 22, youngest son of the late Joseph Stowe, died in Pembroke on Aug. 5.
- 1833, Feb. 12: Louisa Susan Stowe, eldest daughter of the late Willis R. Stowe, married John T. Wainwright, in Pembroke on Feb. 9, by Rev. J.F. Lightbourn.
- 1834, April 1: Mrs. Esther Stowe, aged 80, died in Pembroke on March 24.
- 1834, April 15: Miss Margaret Jane Stowe, aged 33, eldest daughter of the late John Stowe, died in Pembroke on April 13.

- 1835, Nov. 10: Daniel Stowe, senior, drowned on Nov. 5, in a boating accident off George's Bay, Sandy's Parish. Twelve people in a small boat, of 13 foot keel, with mainsail and jib, belonging to William Cooper of Port Royal, had come, from the Dockyard, between Tucker's Island and the mainland, in order to land some of the people there. The boat gybed and sank. Men who were roofing a house nearby saw the accident, ran, and got a boat to go the rescue, as did Robert Tucker, son of D.R. Tucker, and William Tucker. Some people were saved, but just in time, including Daniel Stowe's son, Daniel.
- 1837, May 2: Mary Stowe, youngest daughter of the late Solomon J. Stowe, married William Hall Darrell, at Christ Church, Devonshire, on April 27, by Rev. J.F. Lightbourn.
- 1838, April 17: Frances Eliza Stowe, aged 32, youngest daughter of Mrs. Sarah Stowe, died at the Lane, April 16.
- 1839, Feb. 12: William J. Stowe, aged 36, a native of Bermuda, eldest son of the late Joseph Stowe, junior, died at St. Vincent on Dec. 30, 1838.
- 1839, July 16: Hon. William Stowe, in his 52nd year, died at St. Vincent on June 27, late of H.M. Council, St. Vincent, previously of House of Assembly, St. Vincent, only surviving child of the late John Stowe, senior, of Bermuda. He had been in mercantile pursuits in St. Vincent and Martinique for about 30 years.
- 1840, Nov. 24: Thomas Stowe, of St. Vincent, married Eliza Moody Bingay, daughter of James Bingay of Tusket Village, Nova Scotia, on Oct. 12, by Rev. Mr. Gilpin. (from Yarmouth, N.S. Herald, Oct. 16)
- 1842, April 19: Maria Elizabeth Stowe, aged 20, daughter of James Stowe, died in St. George's on April 15.
- 1843, March 28: Louisa Wainwright, nee Stowe, wife of John T. Wainwright, in her 29th year, died at Point Shares, Pembroke, on March 21, leaving her husband and five young children. Her husband is daily expected to return from a short visit to the West Indies. Mrs. Wainwright had come here last fall from Halifax, to spend a few months with her family here in her native land, intending to return to Nova Scotia with her husband in the spring, but was taken with an epileptic attack about 15 days ago. This is the second bereavement in this family in a short period; the brother of the deceased, Hastings Stowe, was lost at sea on the brig Tamar, of which he was Captain, en route from Halifax to Trinidad about a year ago, in his 30th year.

- 1845, Sept. 9: Henry Mills Stowe married Edith Stowe Tuzo, elder daughter of Thomas S. Tuzo, at Pembroke Church on Sept. 4.
- 1850, Aug. 20: Brown Stowe, aged 83, a respectable coloured man, died in Pembroke on Aug. 10, leaving 60 descendants, 6 children, 29 grandchildren, 25 great grandchildren.
- 1852, March 2: Thomas Stowe, birth of a son in Hamilton on Feb. 29.
- 1852, July 20: Mrs. Susannah Granbery, widow of the late John Granbery, of Norfolk, Virginia, and eldest daughter of the late Joseph Stowe of Point Shares, Bermuda, died on June 30 in her 81st year.
- 1853, March 1: Mrs. Thomas Stowe, aged 27, died on Jan. 11 in Yarmouth, Nova Scotia.
- 1853, Dec. 20: Henry Austen Stowe, aged 18, son of Capt. Thomas Stowe, died in Pembroke on Dec. 7.
- 1855, Sept. 11: Rev. Solomon J. Stowe, M.A., aged 49, a native of Bermuda, died on Aug. 24 at the American Hotel, Staunton, Virginia.

- 1856, Jan. 1: George Stowe, aged 33, died at the Naval Hospital, Ireland Island, on Dec. 25, 1855, leaving a widow and 1 child. Odd Fellows Burial ceremony.
- 1856, Nov. 25: Lucius Stowe, aged 6, son of Edward Stowe, died of fever on Nov. 23 in Smith's Parish.
- 1863, May 5: Dinah Stowe, aged about 93, a coloured woman, native of Pembroke, died on April 27 at The Lane, Pembroke, leaving " 9 children of her grandchildren".
- 1864, March 29: Mrs. Sarah Stowe, aged 84, widow of John Stowe, died in Pembroke on March 22.
- 1866, June 26: Miss Mary T. Stowe, daughter of Capt. Thomas Stowe of Yarmouth, N.S., married Rev. Frederic J.F. Lightbourn, son of Rev. Joseph F. Lightbourn, at Pembroke Church on June 19.
- 1866, Aug. 21: John J. Stowe, aged 62, 2nd son of the late Joseph Stowe, died on Aug. 16 at the residence of his sister, Miss Georgiana Stowe, Pembroke.
- 1866, Dec. 4: Capt. Thomas Stowe, in his 69th year, a native of Bermuda, died at Yarmouth, Nova Scotia, on Oct. 8.
- 1867, Feb. 12: Daniel S. Stowe, aged 41, died in Pembroke on Feb. 10, leaving a mother and sister.
- 1868, Sept. 22: John Stowe, aged 66, died in Pembroke on Sept. 19.

- 1876, April 11: Wilhelmina W. Stowe, aged 16 years, 4 days, eldest daughter of the late William Stowe, died in Paget on April 6, leaving a mother, 2 brothers, 1 sister.
- 1879, May 27: William Henry Stowe, aged 47, editor and proprietor of the St. Vincent Witness since 1862, died at St. Vincent of hepatitis on April 23. (from St. Vincent Witness of April 24).
