PREFACE

The stirring story of maritime activity in Gaspesia may be found, in part, in the old, yellowed pages of deeds and documents preserved in the Archives of Québec. One of the titles of such deeds is that of CHARTER PARTY - an agreement by which a vessel was chartered for a specific voyage or trading expedition. Another common title is that of PROTEST where the details of loss through shipwreck, or other marine misadventure may be found. Such formal documents recall the careers of Gaspesian mariners and masters, the partners in business ventures, and in the case of PROTESTS detailed information on the building, specifications and registration of the vessel concerned.

The following CHARTER PARTY deed recalls Thomas Caldwell of New Carlisle, Mariner and Master of the good schooner or vessel called the "ALBION". Thomas was the grandson of Robert and Sarah Todd Caldwell, pioneer Loyalist settlers of New Carlisle and son of Robert Caldwell, Jr. and his wife Agnes Chisholm. Seafaring was in his blood as his father and uncles, Andrew Todd, James and John Caldwell had been noted shipbuilders and mariners. Captain Thomas was subsequently lost at sea in the wreck, off Cape Breton, of the Caldwell schooner, "BACHELOR". The wrecked vessel was found drifting at sea by an American vessel and the report of her captain is on record.

James and John Boyle were two of the sons of James and Charlotte McKinnon Boyle of the South-West Arm of Gaspé Bay. Reference to this Boyle family will be found in the article of GASPE OF YESTERDAY, "SPRING GROVE" [SPEC, July 6,1982] but it is of interest to note here that Charlotte McKinnon was the daughter of Neil McKinnon, Sr. of New Carlisle, a pioneer settler. Her sister, Flora, was Mrs. John Ascah of Peninsula. Richard Annett, son of William and Elizabeth Siddon Annett of Peninsula, was linked to the Boyle brothers through his marriage to their sister, Mary, and through association in shipbuilding.

Thus in 1811 we find reco d of the schooner, MARY BOYLE, owners John Boyle and George Boyle together with Thomas Boyle and Richard Innett, all of Gaspé. Square sterned schooner, 80 tons. In 1818 there is record of the schooner, ANNABELLA, owners George Boyle, mariner, together with John Boyle, Richard Annett, James Boyle, Felix Boyle, mariners all of Gaspé. Master, George Boyle. Square sterned schooner, 87 tons.

As the script of the actual CHARTER PART deed of June, 1827 may prove difficult for the modern reader, it is followed by a printed version in this article:

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TEXT OF DEED

5 June 1827

Charter Party

Thos. Caldwell, Schooner Albion to John Boyle and others

On the Fifth Day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty seven and Before us the undersigned Notaries Public duely admitted and sworn in the Province of Lower Canada and residing in the City of Quebec in the said Province personally came, appeared and were present Thomas Caldwell, Mariner and Master of the good schooner and vessel called the Albion of the burthen of forty two tons register measure at present now lying in the Port of Quebec, acting in his behalf for and in the name of the owner or owners of the said vessel, of the one Part. And Messers John Boyle and James Boyle of Gaspé, acting as well for themselves as for Richard Annett of the same place and taking burthen upon themselves of the said Richard Annett, of the other Part - Which said parties acting as aforesaid have made and entered into the Charter Party of the said schooner or vessel called the Albion following, that is to say, the said Thomas Caldwell, acting as aforesaid doth hearby let and charter the said vessel with all her tackle, apparel, sails and furniture for and during the space and term of four months to commence and be counted from the second day of June and fully to be complete and ended on the like day of the month of October now next ensuing, with the said John Boyle, James Boyle and Richard Annett hereto present as aforesaid and accepting hereof for themselves and the said Richard Annett the said John and James Boyle. And it is hereby agreed that the said Thomas Caldwell shall continue Master of the said vessel during the present Charter Party and that Hugh Caldwell, now a sailor aboard of the said vessel shall also continue and remain in the said vessel as a sailor and that both Thomas Caldwell and Hugh Caldwell shall perform and do all and every the duties necessary and required of them in their respective capacities aforesaid and in the event of sickness or death they or either of them shall be replaced with other fit persons or an other fit person at the cost of the owners of the vessel and he shall be held to keep the said vessel in a good seaworthy condition, provided and equipped with all sails, tackle, apparel and furniture for the navigation and the service of the whale fishery in the River and Gulf

in which the said Parties intend employing her, but all extra gear or tackle necessary for such fishery shall be furnished amd provided by the latter Party at their expense with liberty to remove and take away the same at the end of the present Charter Party, also that the Party chartering shall furnish and provide the said vessel with all other men necessary for her navigation and provide her and the other Party, Thomas and Hugh Caldwell in all provisioning and other necessaries unconnected with her tackle, apparel, and furniture other wear and tear --- and also repairs upon her hull, masts, yards or spars.

The Present Charter Party is thus made and entered into for and in consideration of the lump sum of Eighty five Pounds Halifax Currency, being twenty one pounds, five shillings for each and every month of the present Charter Party and which the said John Boyle and James Boyle and the said Richard Annett do hereby promise, bind and oblige themselves, and their respective heirs and assigns to pay unto the said Thomas Caldwell or the bearer or bearers of these presents in due form of Law in manner following, that is to say, the sum of Forty Pounds in two months from the date herein and by a draft or Bill on some person or persons at the City of Quebec, payable thirty days after sight. Other residue or balance of the said amount of hire on the end and termination of the present Charter Party.

These presents to be duely enjoined and observed on pain of all costs, losses, damages and interests resulting from default therein.

This done and passed in the City of Quebec at the office of L.T. McPherson, one of the said Notaries, on the day and year first above written. In Faith and Testimony whereof the said parties hereto these presents, first duely read, severally set and subscribe their respective names and signatures in the presence of us, the said Notaries, also hereto subscribing -
