GASPESIAN CARGO OF THE SCHOONER "OTTER"PROEM

While considerable attention has been given by chroniclers of Gaspé's past to the exports of the fishery by major companies, such as those of Robin, Janvrin, Fruing, LeBoutillier, etc., much less has been recorded of those smaller enterprises and individuals that traded in the provincial market. We are reminded of this smaller but none the less significant trade in the following PROTEST of Captain Xavier Dugal, Master Mariner and Master of the Schooner "OTTER" with respect to the cargo loaded at Gaspé for delivery to Québec in 1827.

2 November, 1827. PROTEST. XAVIER DUGAL, SCHOONER "OTTER"

By this Public Instrument of Declaration and Protest, Be it known and made manifest unto all to whom these presents shall come, or whom the same may in any way concern, that on this Second day of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty seven, Before the undersigned Notaries Public, duly admitted and sworn for the Province of Lower Canada, and residing in the City of Quebec, personally came, appeared and were present Xavier Dugal, Master Mariner and Master of the Schooner or vessel called the OTTER of Quebec of the burthen of forty three tons or thereabouts, now lying in the Port of Quebec and Pierre Fontaine, Louis Fontaine and Alexandre Chamberland, Seamen of and on board of the said vessel, who, in pursuance of a protest entered and noted by the said Xavier Dugal in the office of L.T. MacPherson, one of us the said Notaries on the first day of November, Instant, against the perils of the River and in extension of the same -

The said Xavier Dugal, Louis Fontaine, Pierre Fontaine and Alexandre Chamberland, of their own free will and voluntary accord, in the presence of us the said Notaries, did and by these presents do jointly and severally allege, affirm, declare, protest and say that the said Schooner or vessel called the OTTER, being tight, staunch and strong, well and sufficiently manned, provided, equipped and furnished with all things needful and necessary for a voyage to sea, loaded with a cargo of fish oil and other produce, and her hatches

well and sufficiently caulked and covered, they, the said appearers, set sail from the Port of Gaspé, in the District of Gaspé, on the twentieth day of October last on a voyage to the Port of Quebec where she arrived on the thirtieth day of October last, that on the day aforesaid of their arrival in the said Port of Quebec, after tieing up with her best bower cable and anchor, there came on to blow a very heavy gale from the Eastward which drove her alongside of the Bank of the harbour of Cul-de-Sac of the said Port of Quebec, where she remained in a perilous situation -

And in order to get her off and for her preservation and the preservation of her cargo it became absolutely necessary to cut her aforesaid cable, which was instantly done by the orders of the said Master, by means whereof the said vessel was got off the shore and to a place of safety -

And the said appearers do further jointly and severally allege, affirm, declare, protest and say that all and singular the losses, injuries, damages and detriments which have happened to the said vessel and her cargo were in no way owing to or occasioned by any unseamanship, mismanagement or neglect of any of them the said appearers or of any of the rest of the crew of the said vessel but solely and entirely to the perils before mentioned, and that during the said voyage they and the remainder of the crew of the said vessel used their utmost endeavours and exertions to preserve the said vessel and her cargo from damage.

To the truth of all which said several matters and things herein before alleged and declared, they, the said appearers, have duly and severally made oath on the Holy Evangelists of Almighty God before us the said Notaries. -

Now therefore that these presents may enjoy full force and effect, we, the said Notaries, at the request of the said Xavier Dugal, did protest as by these presents, we do most solemnly protest against all and every person and persons whom the same doth, shall or may in any wise concern, and do declare that all damages, losses and detriments which have happened to the said vessel and her cargo are and ought to be borne by the proprietors of or underwriters on the same, or whomsoever else it shall or may in any wise concern, the same having

occured as before mentioned and not by or through insufficiency  
of the said vessel or neglect of the said Xavier Dugal, his officers  
or any of his mariners.

Thus Done, Protested and Sworn to in the City of Quebec in the said Province of Lower Canada (where no stamps are used) at the office of L.T. MacPherson, one of us the said Notaries, on the day and year first above written -

In Faith and Testimony whereof the said appearers have to the original of these presents, first duly read, and remaining of record in the said office, severally set their hands in the presence of us, the said Notaries, also hereunto subscribing.
