GASPE MILITIA OFFICERS FOR 1821 AND 1832FOREWORD

A previous issue of this series, GASPE OF YESTERDAY, has recalled "GASPESIAN MILITIA OFFICERS OF 125 YEARS AGO". This subsequent issue delves still deeper into time past to recall "GASPE MILITIA OFFICERS FOR 1821 AND 1832. As the 1821 roll, in particular, includes a number of men of the first generation of the pioneer Gaspé settlers, it will serve as evidence of the long and deep tradition of military service in those Gaspé families.

Lieut.-Colonel Henry B. Johnston, J.P., Commanding Officer of the Gaspé Division of Militia for 1821, was one of Gaspé's most widely known citizens. Through his marriage with Charlotte McPherson he was not only the son-in-law but the successor in business to Daniel McPherson, acknowledged by Charles Robin to have been his only successful competitor in the Fishery of Gaspé. By 1821 Daniel McPherson was resident at the Ile-aux-Grues Seigniory that he had purchased in 1802 and his business at Point St. Peter was in the capable hands of Henry Johnston.

Lieut.-Colonel Henry O'Hara of Gaspé Basin was one of the sons of Felix O'Hara who had settled at the Basin in 1764. Henry inherited the property of his father when Felix O'Hara died in 1805 and was widely known as one of the leading citizens of Gaspesia. Major John Douglas McConnell was linked to the O'Hara family through his marriage with Jane Baird O'Hara, daughter of Henry O'Hara's brother, Hugh O'Hara.

These Militia Rolls will serve to remind the reader of the persistence of certain family names in Gaspé
