#### FOREWORD

Reader reaction to published articles of "GASPÉ OF YESTERDAY" is always welcome insofar as it helps to set straight the record of our Gaspesian heritage.

The following letter of Betty Le Maistre Freeman with reference to PART III of "REFERENCES IN JERRI JADIS" published by SPEC on December 4th.,1991 is a positive contribution to that end.

# Letters

Dear Editor:

I was very pleased to see a reference to my family in Ken Annett's Gaspe of Yesterday column of the December 4th. SPEC. I find all the historical articles, and especially ones to do with Jersey, of very great interest.

However, the facts reported in relation to my father are badly mixed up and I would like to set them down correctly. A similar confusion occurs in Marion Turk's Quiet Adventurers in Canada, page 358. (I may say that any reference in this book to families I know is full of errors.)

Maybe the confusion is due to the fact that my father and my eldest brother bore the same name and died within a few weeks of each other in 1962. My father, Charles Philip Le Maistre (1895-1962), was born in Jersey and died of a heart attack in June 1962. He is buried in the United Church Cemetery in New Carlisle East. Lydia Le Maistre was his sister. My brother, Charles Philip Le Maistre Jr. (1923-1962), was born in Sayabec, Quebec, and died in May 1962 as the result of an accident. He is buried in the Anglican Church Cemetery in Port Daniel.

I remember meeting George Le Feuvre when he visited our home in New Carlisle in 1964. He was an acquaintance of Frank Le Maistre (no relation) who was at the time putting the finishing touches to his Dictionnaire Jersiais - Français which was published in 1966 for the 900th anniversary of the Battle of Hastings.

It was in 1964 that George F.Le Feuvre toured the Gaspé
Peninsula in search of its Channel Island heritage.

PART I of this "GASPÉ OF YESTERDAY" series began with his visit to Grand Étang and thence via Fox River, Griffon Cove,
Jersey Cove, Grand Grève, Cap Aux Os, Peninsula, Rose Bridge,
Gaspé Basin, Sandy Beach, Malbay.

PART II continued the pilgrimage to Barachois, Corner-ofthe-Beach, Percé, Bonaventure Island, Cape Cove.

PART III, as published, reflected comments on Channel Island families of Grand River, L'Anse-aux-Gascons, Port Daniel, Shigawake, Hopetown.

This PART IV finds the author of "JERRI JADIS" entering
Paspebiac with its rich Channel Island history and heritage.
It seems appropriate to recall the opening paragraphs of his text:
