The Census of 1871

Gaspe Bay South; 53 families; 322 souls; 255 Anglicans; 63 Catholics;; 8,061 arpents of land cultivated; 853 bushels of wheat; 19 bushels of oats; 160 bushels of rye; 7,690 bushels of potatoes; 189 head of cattle; 25 horses; 295 sheep and 165 pigs

Gaspe Bay North; 14 families; 90 souls; 70 Anglicans; 20 Catholics; 1,900 arpents of occupied land; 160 arpents of cultivated land; 190 bushels of wheat; 1,825 bushels of potatoes; 55 head of cattle; 7 horses; 81 sheep and 51 pigs.

In 1861 the population of the Municipality of Gaspe Bay North, numbered 361; Gaspe Bay South 520. The Village of Gaspe had a population of 174 souls in 1811 and 307 in 1891.

In 1958 the population of the Municipality of Haldimand, numbered 600; York 825; Gaspe Bay South (Wakeham) 1,228; Gaspe 2,800, (Village 2,624); Sydenham South (Fontenelle) 971; Gaspe Bay North 580; Grand Greve 946.
