He built a home on lot no. 17 near the river and near what is known as Lousia Boyle's Brook.

James' Family devoted most of their lives to the new cocuntry as Army and Navy Personelle, for their services they were granted much land. The Boyle Family one time owned more than 2,000 acres of land in Fox River, Grande Greve, Rosebridge, Barchois, and on both sides of the York River in Wakeham alone they owned all the land on the first range from George Bechervaise's west to Henry Patterson's Brook.
