Clark's Nationality - Irish

William, first member of the Clark family to settle in Gaspé, arrived about 1828 from England and settled in Wakeham on Lot No. 24; land he bought from O'Hara. He built his home on the south side of the road near the home that Ralph Clark, a great-grandson, occupies today.

In February, 1862, the worse sickness in the Bay's history struck the Clark family. William and six of his children died within three weeks with diphtheria.

The Clark family is divided in three sections and is separated by letters from A to C.

Section "A" includes the records of First Generation, Second Generation, and James of the Third Generation.
