EDEN'S NATIONALITY ENGLISH!

The birth of Sarah Burwood on January 20th, 1828, John second child is the first records of the Eden family to appear in Gaspé. Records show that John's first child John Henry was born in 1825 in England. This would indicate that John Sr. his wife and child and his brother Joseph all from Stokesly England arrived in Gaspé between 1825 and 1828, upon their arrival they made their home in Wakeham on the property that is occupied today by Charlie Palmer, Joseph Eden, Allan Eden, and Richard Miller.

John's wife died and he remarried in 1838 to Ellen Maria Boyle and moved to her home that stood in front of Wakeham's old cemetery. Later his son John Henry married and made his home on his old property,

Joseph married in 1832 and built a home on the property that Percy Eden occupies today. Later he moved to Gaspé Basin and built a home on the property west of Chretien St. His son William and Joseph Jr. both married and made their home on his Wakeham property. John and Joseph Eden were very active in Public Affairs and during their life time held various municipal and civil posts they were also among the most permanent business men.
