Jean Garique said Languedoc was born in 1680 in Bretèle, diocese of Castre at Languedoc, France and was married on January 29th 1704 at Quebec to the daughter of Claude Bourget and Marie Couture.

The double name of Jean Garique Languedoc was taken from his birth place. In "Le Grand Larousse" explanation: Garique was taken from the Provencal language "garriga" meaning 'a waste land of small oak trees in the south of France'.

Francois Languedoc I, was the only son of Jean G. L. and Marie Couture. He was married on June the 15th 1734 to Catherine Martel born in 1713 at Chateau Richer near Quebec, daughter of Jean Martel and Jeanne Rester.

Francois was born at Quebec in 1713 and died at Quebec in 1748. His widow, Catherine Martel remarried in 1751 at Beaumont to Louis Vien and died in 1804.

The name of Jean Garique Languedoc birth place is the name the family have always used as they did in his days. He died at quebec on February 20th 1726. His widow remarried to Jean Potvin in 1728.

Jacques Languedoc, son of Francois and Catherine was born at Quebec on September 12th 1745. His first marriage in 1772 at Quebec was to Marie Larue the daughter of Louis Larue and Eliza laMontagne.

Being a widower he remarried on July the 28th 1772 at Levis to Angelique Samson, daughter of Ignace Samson, _ Cont'd.
