Mullin's Nationality - English

Nicholas, a sea captain and veteran of the French and English War of 1793, and first member of the Mullin family to settle in Gaspe, after surviving a ship-wreck on the Baie DesChauleur, he found his way to Peninsula in 1795. Upon his arrival he was granted a lot of land in Peninsula for his war services. His old homestead has long been demolished. Herbert Stillman Mullin, a great grandson of Nicholas resides on his old property to-day.

The Mullin family is divided into nine sections and are separated by letters from A to I.

Section A includes the records of the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd generation and Margaret Ellen of the 3rd generation.
