PATTERSONS STONE HOUSE

THE PATTERSON'S NATIONALITY SCOTCH

It is mostly likely that the Stone House Pattersons and the Pioneer Pattersons come from the same stock and that their relationship connect in Scotland generations back. How-ever they both came to Gaspe as separate families and have no known relation.

William first member of the Stone House Pattersons to settle in Gaspe arrived around 1798. From where is not known. He bought lot no. 14 in Wakeham from John and George Boyle and built a lime stone house near the York River, the first house of its kind to be built in Gaspe. At his death in 1816 he bequeathed his house and property to his son Benjamin. In 1846 it was handed down to his grand son Abraham, while in the latter ~~16~~ hands in 1899 the house a hundred years old was destroyed by fire. Around 1910 Lucy a daughter of Abraham sold the property to Francis Annett, today it is owned by John Annett.

The walls of the old house are still standing and cherry trees are growing within its former enclouser. The stone in the walls are still so hard that it is scarcely possible to chip little pieces off them.

The Stone House Pattersons Family is divided into four sections and is separated by letters from A to D.
