Savidant nationality is recarded in the 1861 Personal census as Guernsey French. But it is difficult to say if this is correct as the spelling of the name has changed many times through the years. The name first appears on a land claim in 1819 (Sairdan) in the Personal census of 1861 (Salvidan) in land sales around 1890 (Sadvant) and to day the name is spelled Savidant.

John Sr. the first member of the Savidant family to settle in Gaspe is believed to have been picked up by a salt boat crew, when he was a small boy He was found in a small boat all alone in the Bay of Bisque off the west coast of Francethe crew brought him to Gaspe and left him in hands of an Unknown lady.

The time of John Sr. arrival in Gaspe is not known how ever he was married in 1815 and made a claim in 1819 for his land he bought from the O'Hara in Gaspe Bay South (Wakeham) John Sr. old home that was demolished many years ago was built west of F. Bannier home near the road the land changed hands years ago and the Savidants moved to York where they reside to day.
