Suddard's Nationionalty - English

Reverend John, the first member of the Suddard family in Gaspe, arrived in Quebec City in 1820 with his wife. In 1823 he was sent to Gaspe by the Bishop of Quebec (Jacob Mountain). He settled in Gaspe Harbour on Lot No. 6, land that he bought from the Dean's. The site of his homestead is just west of the half road, The property is owned by the Hospital today.

In 1823 Thomas, a brother to Rev. John Suddard, arrived. He settled in the east end of York on Lot.No.2, land he bought from the Dean's. In the centre of the lot near the water Thomas built a log home. Around 1850 he built a frame house, which was destroyed by fire in the spring of 1957. Arthur, a grandson of Thomas, resides on the property today.

The Suddard family is divided into seven sections and is separated by letters from A to G.

Section "A" includes the records of First Generation and Rev. John of the Second Generation.
